Application Schedule:

- Spring internship: March/April/May
Applications accepted until January 15th
- Summer internship: June/July/August
Applications accepted until March 1st
- Fall internship: September/October/November/December
Applications accepted until June 15th
- Winter internship: January/February/March
Applications accepted until October 15th

If accepted you must have had a tetanus vaccine within the last five years. As our internships are unpaid, interns are considered volunteers so the zoo does not provide any medical coverage for on or off the job injuries or incidents.

THE AQUARIUM AT POINT DEFIANCE

Internship Information

The internship program at the Aquarium of Point Defiance Zoo and Aquarium is designed to provide individuals with practical learning experience while gaining valuable knowledge related to his/her career goals. Requests for internship positions are evaluated on experience - professional and/or volunteer, academic achievement, interview success, and positions available.

To apply for an internship within the Aquarium department at Point Defiance Zoo and Aquarium you must:

1. Be currently enrolled in a college or university, or have recently graduated from a college or university.
2. Have a minimum of one year of course work in a major field of study to be applied during the internship (e.g. biology, zoology, animal behavior, psychology, etc.).
3. Be capable of the physical abilities required to work with animals (i.e. lift 50 pounds, etc.).
4. Submit an application.
5. Submit a cover letter. (including your career goals)
6. Submit a resume.
7. Submit answers to application questions.
8. Submit two letters of recommendation from an advisor or supervisor. Each letter should specify the internship position for which you are applying.
9. Undergo a phone or on site interview.
10. Commit to 32-40 hours a week for 3 to 4 months. A minimum of 400 hours is required.
11. Once selected, verify ability to swim.
12. Once selected, provide proof of a tetanus vaccination within the past 5 years.

Aquarium Internship Description

The Aquariums at Point Defiance Zoo offers the most diverse display of live animals throughout the entire Point Defiance facility. This collection is made up of over 300 different species of fish and invertebrates, from varying ocean habitats along the Pacific Rim. The diversity of marine life at the aquarium provides for some unique challenges and opportunities for career oriented students in the field of marine biology.

The internship program at the aquarium at Point Defiance Zoo is designed to provide participants with practical learning experience and knowledge in aquatic animal husbandry. It can also provide an opportunity to do additional projects for college credit. In return, the intern makes a significant contribution to the Aquariums.

The aquarium internship is an intense, concentrated, non-paid position that allows an individual to assist aquarists in almost all areas of basic aquarium husbandry while gaining practical learning experience and knowledge in preparation for a career in a public aquarium.

Interns work 5 days a week for a period of 3 to 4 months, giving them an approximate total of 400 – 500 hours worked. A minimum of 400 hours is required.

This internship is designed to provide instruction in the following areas:

1. Animal Husbandry
 - General maintenance and care of marine fish and invertebrates systems
 - Animal observations
2. Nutrition and Diet
 - Food preparation and feeding techniques
3. Record Keeping
4. Water Quality
 - Maintaining proper aquarium water quality parameters
 - Properties of natural seawater
 - Biological cycles in aquariums
5. Public Education
 - Interpretation of exhibits
 - Informal public contact
 - Tours and presentations
6. Knowledge of Marine Fish and Invertebrates
 - Natural history, behavior, scientific names



Aquarium Intern Assignments

During your internship, you will be asked to complete the following tasks:

Journal

Keep informal journals describing your daily activities and to record your thoughts and experiences, and any questions or concerns you would like to share with the staff. The internship coordinator will review your journal monthly to evaluate your progress.

Monthly Meetings

Once a month you will meet with the Aquarium's internship coordinator. This will be an opportunity to evaluate how your internship is progressing, review your journal entries, and answer any questions.

Daily Assignments

On a daily basis you will be responsible for assisting the staff with routine aquarium husbandry and maintenance. The assignments will consist of upkeep of visitor galleries, behind the scenes exhibit maintenance, food preparation, feeding of animal diets, and general in-house area chores.

Personal Exhibit

During the internship, you will be assigned the responsibility of caring for one exhibit aquarium. Under the direction and guidance of the staff, you will learn proper techniques of cleaning, feeding and observing "your" exhibit.

Personal Project

Depending on the requirements of your college or university and the number of credits you will be receiving for your internship, you will be asked to come up with a project to implement under the guidance of the aquarium staff. The following are suggestions:

- ◆ Develop a collection or exhibit plan for a potential new exhibit species and/or habitat.
- ◆ Create and carry out a research project on one of the following topics relating to the aquarium collection; animal behavior, water chemistry, fish pathology, aquaculture, or fish nutrition.
- ◆ Do an in-depth library research project on one aquarium species and provide staff with copies of the latest research literature.
- ◆ Create an interpretive presentation for the general public on one or more of the aquarium's exhibits.

You will be required to submit a written proposal for your project no later than one week into the internship.
